1) Please provide a short summary of your project's activities.

Executive Summary:

Attia Welfare Society implemented a project **“A Safe & Tolerant Campus”** with students of 10 Natural Sciences Departments of The Islamia University of Bahawalpur to create tolerant and safe IUB campus through promoting peace, tolerance to end violent extremism. Core objectives achieved through this grant. The proposed grant of Attia Welfare Society implemented in (10) departments of the Islamic University Bahawalpur (IUB) i.e. Social Work (focal department), Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Statistics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education Training. New peace clubs were formed and capacitated on countering violent extremism. Capacity building of (10) peace clubs were on the themes of CVE, critical thinking and leadership, enhanced through organizing capacity building session.

Activity Objectives:

- Objective 1 (Output):** To form 10 peace clubs within Natural Sciences departments and build the capacity of selected students (300) and university staff (50) of IUB around CVE themes, critical thinking and leadership skills
- Objective 2 (Outcome):** To build capacity of the peace clubs to counter VE narratives at IUB
- Objective 3 (IR):** To increase engagement of universities on CVE initiatives at AeP's targeted campuses
- Objective 4 (Impact):** Enhance tolerance within and across communities

Under the project, AWS formed (10) new peace clubs and build their capacity to enhance tolerance, peace, inclusiveness and diversity. AWS has closely worked with IUB Administration, Department of Social Work, University Vice Chancellor Office, and Directorate of Students Affairs for the successful implementation of this grant activities.

AWS also organized trainings on CVE, leadership and critical thinking for selected peace clubs' members

and university staff of Natural Sciences departments of IUB.

(300) selected students and (50) selected faculty members and administrative staff from 10 departments remained closely involved in the grant activity. These Peace clubs have been notified by the university and allocated safe spaces for interaction, dialogue and increased engagement. AWS conducted (36) Social Action Projects (SAPs) with these Peace Clubs. In total (36) SAPs were conducted by AWS in which (3332) student from (10) departments including (1608) Female, (1728) Male, (95) Faculty members, (81) Male, (14) female and (19) Persons from intelligentsia, civil society, media and Govt. department, university administration and parliamentarian participated. Total Project beneficiaries of the project (3332) out which (3300) were reached out directly while (32) people reached out indirectly. AWS also ensured and did tremendous efforts to notify the peace clubs and work for provision of safe places to carry out their activities effectively and these activities contributed towards the AeP Punjab objective of increasing engagement of universities on CVE initiatives and larger program objective of enhanced tolerance within and across communities. Attia Welfare Society engaged (10) groups comprising on (300) Peace Club members from (10) natural sciences department of IUB i.e. i.e. Social Work , Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Statistics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education of Islamic University Bahawalpur though orientating on two days training followed by three days capacity of buildings. AWS also coordinated and conducted meetings with Social Welfare Department, District Administration and Law Enforcement Agencies, and briefed them on the project objectives and implementation plan effectively. AWS also took onboard all stake holders i.e. university students, faculty, and administration of The Islamia University of Bahawalpur for the successful implementation of the project.

Attia Welfare Society formed (10) Peace Club comprising on (10) natural sciences department. These peace club members were selected through organizing and followed by social mobilization seminars where peace messages were delivered. after formation of Peace Clubs, AWS conducted (02) two days training sessions with on CVE, Peace Promotion, leadership, decision making and conflict management followed by (03) three days on Leadership, critical thinking and communication. (03) Days training was also done to sensitize the teachers and deliver the same message to university administration, faculty and teachers. Messages of CVE and Peace promotion were delivered to the students by the trainers and different SAPS activities were planned i.e. dialogue on safe campus, debate competitions on safe campus, panel discussion and celebration of international days to deliver and disseminate message of peace. All these SAPS activities were planned to conduct physically in the university with the students by unfortunately not done in the wake of Covid-19 and revised to conduct online. In total 36 activities were done with these 10 peace club members which helped to increased their knowledge, enhanced capacity, on peace, CVE to end violent behaviour among the students to promote peace, tolerance, harmony and accepting diversity. These project activities contributed a lot and observed especially in the behaviour of the peace club member which is positive symbols which is very encouraging to promote peace building efforts and main peace in the campus to create a positive and appropriate learning environment. If this should then dream of “A Safe and Tolerant Campus” can be achieved.

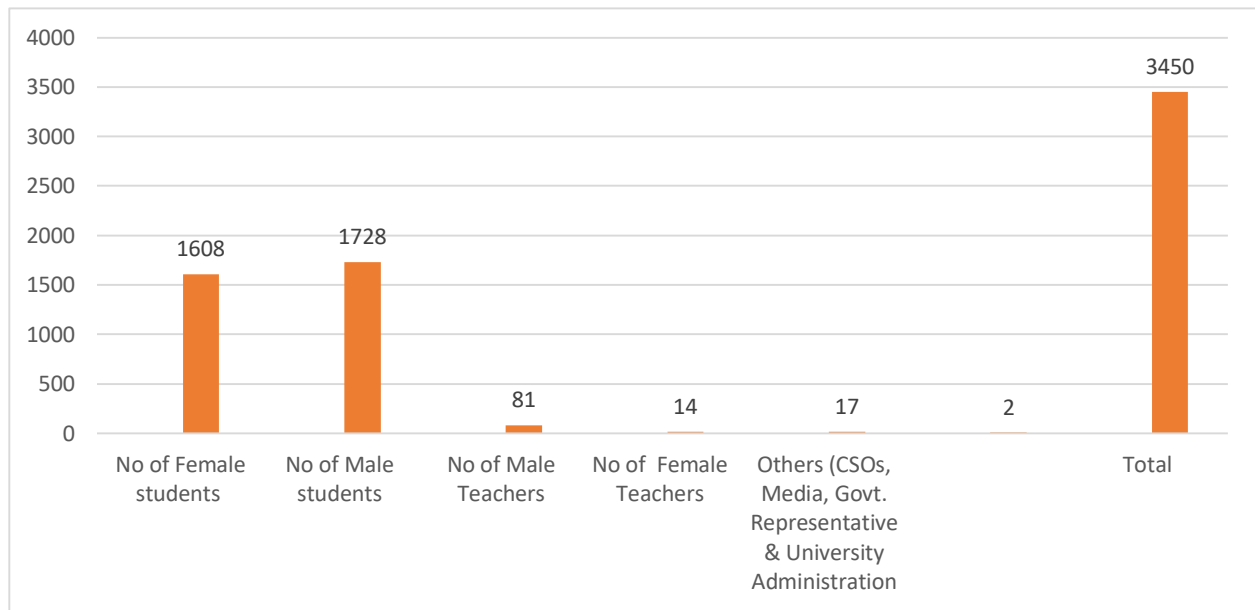


Figure 1. Over all (3450) individuals participated in which (3336) IUB students, (81) Male and (14) Female faculty members, (17) Others, Media , Govt. representatives, district administration, university and (2) female participated

Kick-Off Ceremony

Attia Welfare Organization is implemented project “A Safe & Tolerant Campus” with students of 10 Natural Sciences Departments of The Islamia University of Bahawalpur to create tolerant and safe IUB campus through promoting peace, tolerance for ending violent extremism.

As kick off, its launching ceremony was organized on Jan, 15th, 2020 at Conference hall of Education Faculty of IUB. Activity aimed to engage diversified stakeholders (Students from all 10 departments, faculty members, IUB administration, Students Affairs department representatives, co-partner organization, media personals, volunteers,) from Project targeted departments and IUB administration for sharing about project, its objectives, Activities and output and expected out comes and impact.

The project kick-off ceremony was started with welcome address by the Chief Executive Officer-Attia Welfare Society by warmly welcoming to the audience followed briefing of Project Manager on background of the project, objectives and its upcoming intervention activities (i.e.Technical Assistance, Kick Off Meeting with University Management, MOU with University Administration, Formation of Peace Clubs at Natural Sciences Departments Ten (10), Orientation Training of Newly Formed ten (10) Peace Club Members on CVE and Leadership, Training of the Peace Club Members, Selected Faculty and Administrative Staff on Critical Thinking, Advance Level CVE and Leadership, Panel Discussions Ten (10), Safe Spaces for Peace Clubs, IEC Material, International Days Celebration six (06), Debate Competitions ten (10) and Dialogues on Safe Campuses ten (10).

He also shared that this project will directly focus on 300 student youth members and 50 faculty members along with IUB management for engaging them in all the project activities for their capacity building on peace promotion and tolerance.

The event remained successful and proved fruitful in term of participation from all the 10 departments of natural sciences (faculty members, students, media persons, CSO's and IUB Administration). All the speakers concentrated and affirmed to promote tolerance and peace for creating "A Safe & Tolerant IUB Campus). The participants were mobilized and sensitized to promote and sustain peace to counter violence extremism.

171 individuals (Faculty members from all the 10 departments of Natural Sciences, Students, Media, CSO's, and IUB Administration) participated in the ceremony. Faculty members, University administration, media personnel, civil society members and representatives participated in the event. These important key guest speakers including Mr. Muhammad Ejaz (CEO-AWS), Mr. Muhammad Waseem Aslam (Project Manager), Mr. Aftab Ahmad, Mr. Syed Mansoor Ali Shah (Coordinator Student Affairs), Mr. Dr. Saeed Ahmad (Chairman Department of Sports Sciences), Mr. Dr. Muhammad Awais (Chairman Department of Media Studies), Mr. Dr. Asif Naveed Ranjha (Chairman Department of Social Work), Mr. Muhammad Adnan (Student Representatives), Miss. Rimsha Sehar (Student Representative) and Mr. Muhammad Afzaal (Director Planning & Development) attended the activity.

Social Mobilization Seminars

As AWS is implementing a project "**Safe and Tolerant Campus**" in collaboration with department of Social Welfare The Islamia University Bahawalpur to promote peace, tolerance and inter & interfaith harmony to end violent extremism.

Under the project, AWS organized awareness seminars in different department to mobilize and sensitize the students which started from 16th January 2020 and continued till 21st January 2020.

These seminars formally started with name of Almighty Allaha followed by welcome address to the participants and round of introduction. Later on, AWS team briefed about project and shared objectives. The prime aim of these social mobilization seminars were to engage students, and teachers of 10 selected departments of university to sensitize and mobilize to promote peace, harmony, tolerance to create peaceful environment. The core objective of the project is to create a peaceful environment in the campus. Multiple activities will be carried out in which Social Work Department will take and perform leading role with other (10) selected departments of the University.

It was shared that (10) Peace Clubs will be formed and capacity building of Peace Club members and selected faculty members on CVE themes, critical thinking and leadership skills will enhance their engagement with other students resulting in more conducive and safe campus. Dialogues and panel discussion will be planned along with the formation of safe places in every department for an open discussion. International days and cultural days will be observed.

These Peace Clubs will be notified by Department of Student Affairs, involved in different social and cultural events organized by the university and representing as students bodies representing students from diversified backgrounds. Furthermore, these peace clubs will be implementing 36 Social Action Projects in University to engage and sensitize other students to promote and sustain to towards safe and

tolerant campus In 10 selected departments safe places will be allocated to enhanced engagement and coordination with the larger group of students. Likewise, faculty of the 10 selected departments will be capacitated on CVE for better understanding to lead and create enabling environment for open discussions with in campus.

These social mobilization seminars remained very effective in term of participation by the different departments. Different speakers made speeches on peace, tolerance, interfaith harmony to sensitize, mobilize and synergies the students towards peace and make the university environment peaceful to end to achieve its in ultimate goal of safe and tolerant campus by rejecting violence and ending violent extremism. At the end of seminars (10) Peace Clubs were formed which will work as peace ambassadors to promote peace in the university.

In these seminars Total (571) individuals' students including (254) Female (307) Male students, Faculty members and (10) Teachers from these (10) Departments i.e. Social Work , Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Statistics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education of Islamic University Bahawalpur (IUB) participated. 43% female students, 53 % male students and 2 % teachers participated in these seminars. At the end of each seminar, student asked different questions from mobilization team and the faculty members present at the spot. The questions were related to permission from University management, signing of MOU, engagement of department of student Affairs, role of peace clubs in dissemination of peace messages towards safe and tolerant campus. The mobilization tem gave satisfactory answers to satisfy the students.

Selection of Peace Club members:

To take the selected peace club members and staff on board,AWS conducted (10) mobilization seminars in each department to engage, sensitize and mobile the students. In these mobilization seminars Total (571) individuals' students including (254) Female (307) Male students, Faculty members and (10) Teachers from these (10) Departments i.e. Social Work , Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Statistics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education of Islamic University Bahawalpur (IUB) were approached. These mobilization session played vital role in mobilizing, sensitizing and engaging the students and faculty.

(10) Peace Clubs were formed which will work as peace ambassadors to promote peace in the university. These (10) new peace clubs each consisting of (30) members were capacitated around Peace Promotion and CVE to conduct different activities to engage, sensitize and mobilize other students throughout the campus. These peace clubs were notified by the Department of Student Affairs of the University.(10) Sessions were planned. These peace clubs are representative bodies of the students representing students from diverse backgrounds and playing and effective role in promoting, building and maintaining peace, harmony to counter violent extremism.

AWS has developed and filled membership forms from all those students who showed their willing to be part of the peace clubs and to work as peace ambassador.

(300) students were selected from (10) departments. Students were selected by adapting the criteria approved from AEP team i.e.

- Should be the student of IUB
- Should be regular student of the university
- Should be in age bract of 18 to 29 years

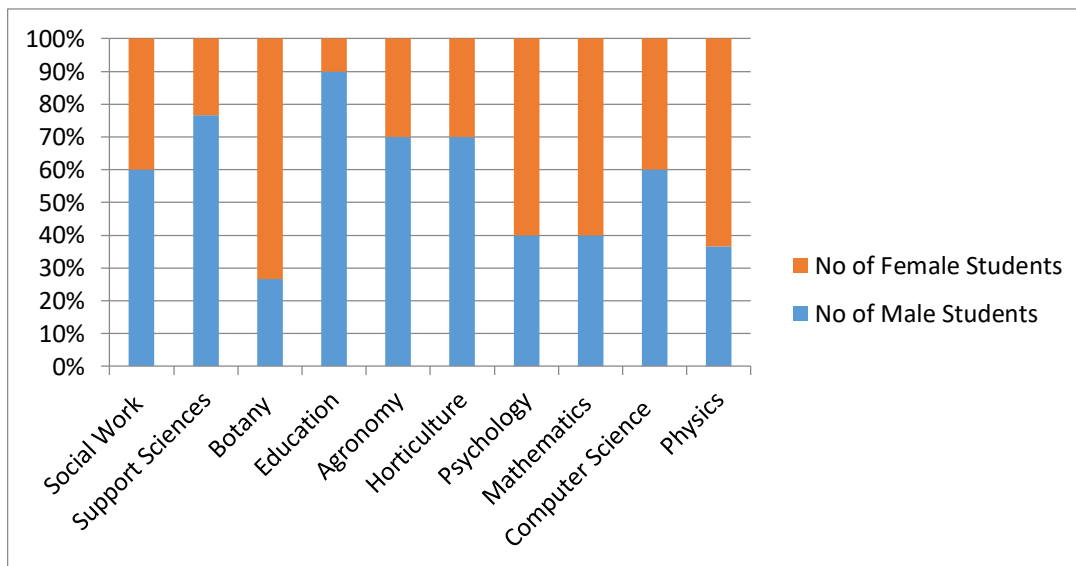
- Willing to work as volunteer
- Determined to work for Peace in campus
- Having believe on patriotism, Peace, Equality and brotherhood
- Should not be involved in any kind of political, social and religious discrimination
- Should believe on interfaith harmony

Preparation of Training Manual and IEC Material:

This activity provided the clear guidelines on Peace Promotion, Countering Violent Extremism and capacity building of students of IUB. Strong coordination and follow up were done with the Consultant. Different consultation session was done in order to finalize the topic and material for the development of training Manual and IEC material.

TWO Days Capacity Building Workshops of Peace Club Members on CVE and Leadership

Attia Welfare Society organized 02 two days trainings of 300 Peace Club members with the aiming to enhance their capacity on Countering Violent Extremism, Peace Promotion and Leadership Skills. Peace Club Members 300 (179 Male & 121 Female) from 10 selected departments of natural sciences of the Islamia University Bahawalpur i.e. i.e. Social Work, Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education participated in the trainings. %age of male and female students is shown in the below graph. Over all 300 peace club members 57% (179) Male & 43% (121) Female) participated.



The Consultant trainer approved by AeP was hired and engaged in designing the training manual and delivering training sessions which were conducted according to the approved manual. These peace clubs were formed through social mobilization seminars in each department to engage, sensitize and mobilize the students on peace, tolerance, and diversity, interfaith and interfaith harmony to contribute to achieve the goal of safe and tolerant campus.

This Two days Peace Promotion and Leadership Training was designed and conducted from January 17th – 30th and February, 24th – 29th and March IST to 3rd, 2020 at the Department of Social Welfare Islamia University Bahawalpur.

The core objective of the project is to create a peaceful environment in the campus. The objectives of the trainings are as follows:

By the end of this two - day's orientation trainings of Peace Promotion and Leadership, the participants will be able to:

The core objective of these training workshops were as under:

- To understand the basic concept of Peace, Peace Education, Counter Violent Extremism.
- To understand about the importance of peace with university towards a safe and tolerate campus
- Capacity building of (300) Peace Club Members Youth members
- Orientation of Peace Club members on Countering Violent Extremism, Peace Promotion and leadership skills, acceptance and tolerance.
- To orientate the selected students on their roles and responsibilities in their respective department
- In these capacity building training workshop the facilitator covers the following topics:
- Behavior: The Participants learned that how to behave in the class, department, and faculty and surrounding of the campus with other students, advantages of good behavior? How role plays good behavior for the development of the peace.
- Behavior & Culture: in this session participants learned about the respect of other's culture, caste, creed, color, language and accepting the diversity.
- Peace: in this session facilitator gave different local examples about peace and put light over the definition, different types of Peace and role of youth.
- Conflict: in this session participants learn about definition, reason of conflict, 5 steps of conflict resolution.
- Leadership: this session help youth to learn about the definition, types of leadership, and qualities of leader.

The prime aim of the training was to build capacity of (10) Peace Clubs Members on peace promotion and leadership to engage, sensitize and mobilize the Peace Club Members to promote peace, harmony and tolerance to create peaceful environment within campus. (10) Peace Clubs were formed comprising on 30 members each and their capacity is built on CVE themes and leadership skills which will enhance their engagement with other students resulting to create conducive, safe and tolerate campus. Social Work Department is leading, coordinating and focal department to perform and conducting the activities. These (10) Peace Clubs will be conducting different activities in their respective departments and engaging students to promote peace and make the university environment peaceful by rejecting and ending violence extremism. Furthermore, these Peace Clubs will be notified by Department of Student Affairs of Islamia University which involves in different social and cultural events organized by the university and represents as students bodies representing students from diversified backgrounds.

Likewise, faculty of the 10 selected departments will be capacitated on CVE for better understanding to lead and create enabling environment for open discussions with in campus. Training Agenda was developed and approved from AeP to cover the basic concepts and key component of development i.e. what is Peace? Peace Education and CVE. Enough time was given to each topic so that participants could understand, learn and deliver accordingly. Following training methodology used :

- ✚ Lectures
- ✚ Multi Media Presentations
- ✚ Discussion
- ✚ Group work

At the end of each training, Mr. Dr. Asif Naveed Ranjha, Chairman Department of Social Work Islamia University Bahawalpur addressed and said that youth have very pivotal role in promoting Peace and their engagement is essential to counter extremism in society. If they will engage and utilized positively, positive change will occur in society. Peace can be build ensure and sustain through your efforts. These two days training session remained very effective and proved fruitful remained very effective in term of students' participation by the different departments.

Three (3) Days Capacity Building Workshops of Peace Club Members and Advanced level training of Selected Staff Members and University Staff Faculty Members on Leadership, Communication and Critical Thinking

Under the project” A Safe and Tolerant Campus “, to amplify the capabilities of the (10) Peace Club members and for faculty members, AWS organized (03) days Training Workshop on Critical Thinking, Social Cohesion and Leadership which started from March 9th 2020, and continued to March, 14th, 2020 in two batches at the Department of Social Welfare Islamia University Bahawalpur. Remaining 08 batches of peace clubs and two batches of faculty members could not be continued due to COVID-19 and emergency suspension of project activities. But being considered the importance of this training project activities were restored and started again conducting training of the remaining 10 batches online adopting ZOOM online training software which continued from July 4th, 2020 to Aug, 6th, 2020.

These online training sessions were conducted on the bases adopted by the IUB as they started online classes for all departments and allowed all kinds of capacity building session for students.

In this critical situation IUB administration played an important role for the continuation of education activities of students. This not only engaged the students in educational activities but also provided a platform to students to learn positive activities. The aim of this training was to build the capacity of 300 Youth Peace Club Members and 50 faculty members of 10 selected departments of IUB.

With the support from IUB administration AWS completed 12 batches of training sessions with 10 selected departments(i.e.27 students from Support Science, 30 Social Work, 32 Psychology, 30 Mathematics, 30 Agronomy, 30 Botany, 45 Education, 30 Computer Science,30 Physics and 31 Horticulture and 50 faculty members from IUB in which total 315 (178) males and (137) females from peace club members participated along with (39) male faculty members and (11) female faculty members ensured their presence for three days to attend this training on advance CVE. Knowledge and capacity

of (365) Peace Club Members and faculty members were enhanced around CVE, Conflicts, conflicts resolutions, Conflicts management approaches, Communication, Styles of communication, standards of communication, radicalization, focusing on critical thinking, barriers to critical thinking, assertiveness and assertive rights, leadership, qualities and characteristics of leaders, leadership styles, social cohesion, diversity, accepting the diversity and Leadership. Over all the trainings attended by 56% male and 44% female peace club members while % male and from faculty members participated. A two days training were also given to these (315)peace club's members followed by (50) Faculty members on CVE, Peace Promotion and Leadership critical thinking and social cohesion to sensitize, mobilize and engage them to achieve the objectives of safe & tolerant campus.

Training Objectives

The primary objective of the training was to build capacity of (300) Peace Clubs Members and 50 faculty members on CVE, standards of communication, radicalization, focusing on critical thinking, barriers to critical thinking, assertiveness and assertive rights, leadership, qualities and characteristics of leaders, leadership styles, social cohesion, diversity, accepting the diversity so that they can play positive and effective role towards achieving the goal of safe and tolerant campus.

By the end of this three - day's training workshop, the participants were able to:

- To understand the basic concept of Critical Thinking, Social Cohesion and Leadership, CVE, diversity and Assertiveness.
- To understand about the importance of Critical Thinking, Social Cohesion and Leadership skills necessary for students to create peace full environment leads towards a safe and tolerate campus
- Define social cohesion and list methods to prevent and counter violent extremism
- List interpersonal barriers and use active listening techniques
- Improve self-confidence, self-esteem, and persistence
- Increase assertive and decrease submissive and aggressive behaviors
- Identify causes of conflicts and methods to prevent and resolve them
- Use seven tools of critical thinking, Practice leadership and team work skills
- List methods of raising funds for Youth Peace Clubs
- Prepare an action plan to apply workshop learning

Training Agendawas designed to cover up the basic concepts and key component which was approved by the AeP team. Sufficient time was given to each topic/content in order to better understanding of the participants.

Training Methodologies:

Different trainings, different methodologies were used comprises on:

- Lectures
- Multi Media Presentations
- Discussion ,Group work&Presentations

At the end of each session, Dr. Asif Naveed Ranjha gave complimentary remarks to sensitize the students with reference to their vital role. If they will engage and utilized positively, positive change will occur in society and peace can be built on sustainable basis. So that's why, Social work department take this initiative and convinced the management and other faculties to launch this project to engage, sensitize and mobilize the students and teachers to make this campus as safe and tolerant for better learning environment. These (3) days training session remained useful and very effective for the participants to improve their knowledge, skills and capacity on critical thinking, social cohesion, Leadership, Assertiveness, and communication. These skills and knowledge will help them to create patience, positive behavior, diversity and acceptability to promote and sustain peace in campus. In these (12) capacity building training session, Total 315(178 Male & 138 female) students including (50) Faculty members (39) Male &(11) female participated.

Panel Discussion Sessions Proceedings

AWS organized (10) virtual panel discussion sessions of 10 natural science departments to mobilize and sensitize the students. These virtual session were started from August 7th 2020 and completed on August 11th, 2020. These virtual sessions started with the introduction of participants of followed by welcome them. The convener Dr. Asif Naved Ranjha Chairman Department of Social Work, briefed about project activities and shared the objectives. The major objectives of these virtual session to engage students, and teachers of 10 natural sciences selected departments of IUB to sensitize and mobilize to promote peace, harmony, accepting the diversity and tolerance to create peaceful environment towards tolerant and safe campus. Multiple activities were carried out in which Social Work Department took the leading role in coordination and conducting the physically activities in collaboration with AWS.

Before initiating these panel discussion, (10) Peace Clubs from (10) natural department were enhanced their capacity on CVE themes, critical thinking, social cohesion, diversity, conflict resolution and management, 3 D- Approach i.e. dialogue, discussion and debate , communication styles and leadership to create a peace full class room environment and the university as well. In relation to that these peace clubs will be further engaging through conducting different social actions in the university to disseminating peace messages. Similarly, (50) faculty members were also given three days training on Critical thinking, leadership and social cohesion for better understanding of CVE and to create enabling environment for open discussions with in class room and the IUB Campus as well. During organizing panel discussion of (10) selected departments i.e. Social Work, Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Statistics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education of IUB, following visionary and experts participated listed below.

These panel discussion session remained very effective in term of participation from different department in which (523) students 55 Agronomy, 10%, 57 Horticulture 11%, 48 Mathematics 9%, 53 Sports Science 10%, 52 Social Work 10%, 51 Psychology 10%, 52 Education 10%, 51 Botany 10%, 53 Physics 10%, 51 Computer Science 10%, students participated in panel discussion. Students asked different questions from the renowned and expert's panel members and they gave satisfactory answers. Speakers realized the importance of peace, tolerance, interfaith harmony, accepting the diversity, resolve and managing conflicts. In total (523) students (276) male & (247) female participated.

Debate Competitions on Safe Campus

Debate gives the students and provide an opportunity to develop and enhance their orally /vocal skills. Different activities planned and organized time to time in university helps the students to think critically, respond well and place his/ her version in well manners. It helps students to remain update on local, regional, national and global current affairs and context.

In association with Social Work Department of the Islamia University Bahawalpur, AWS organized (10) cybernetic debate competitions on "Safe Campus" held virtually from 7th September 2020 To 11th September, 2020 in which total (Male & Female) students from (10) department in which total (Male & Female) students from 57 Psychology (5Male & 52Female), 57 Botany (11Male & 46Female), 49 Education (30Male & 19Female), 47 Computer Science (25Male & 22Female), 53 Physics (38Male & 15Female), and 61 Agronomy (40Male & 21Female), 57 Horticulture (33Male & 24), 53 Mathematics (15 Male & 38 Female) , 50 Social Work (30 Male & 20 Female) and Sports Science (Male & Female) took part. Peace Club members were encouraged to talk openly and share the challenges faced time to time in campus from teachers, seniors students, security personnel, hostel management in order to provide safe and secure learning environment for all.

The students were selected from peace club members comprising on male and female ensuring equal participation. The group were formed to set the motion of debate on safe and tolerant campus. Out of them, some students argued in favor of motion while some were disagreed with the motion by equally considering and the responsibility on shoulders of all stake holders including faculty, administration, security personnel, library, hostel, teachers and students, non-addressing of student's grievance in time, intolerance, grouping among faculty and department and students as well.

The participants highly appreciated and encouraged at the end of each competition. These debate competitions were conducted online virtually as university is closed due to (Covid- 19).

The key aim of these debate competitions were to provide a platform from where students could discuss and express their ideas, views, to create safe, secure, peace full and tolerant Campus by rejecting negativity, intolerance, unacceptability by accepting diversity, ensuring the dignity and respects of others by resolving conflicts through debate along with that with that how peace can build and sustained through engagement of students for safe and tolerant campus.

competitions. The competition revealed some factors that how to build, maintained and sustained the campus environment as peace full safe, and secure for better learning. The speakers appreciated the students to present their version in logical way along with highlighting key challenges related to behavioral issues. The students said that no any single stakeholder is responsible to build maintain and sustained the peace.

For this, every person, every students and every individual will have to plays its key role by liasoning with university administration, coordination with faculty and department of student affairs to maintain peace and a uniformed policy should dev4loped and implemented for all. Each group were given 15 mi minutes to present their version. In each session 6 to seven groups participated.

Debate initiated followed by welcoming the speakers, participants and sharing objectives. Debate started with these words that, this is prime responsibility of the institution, university, to provide, safe, secure, and peaceful space because absence of such places / spaces better learning efficiency. Students also talk on an engaged faculty, its role with modern techniques, class management, changing in university rules and regulations in order to create safe study environment.

In organizing these (10) debate competitions following key guest speakers from university, & Govt. Line Departments regularly in all competitions listed under:

To start debate on safe campus, each students from the groups presented his own version on the basses of experience, observation, behaviour dealt with her during study or staying in hostel. Collective Version of the students is listed below.

Students said that we should maintain distance to deal with others in daily routine life. If a student face any issue he/ she must share with his/ her CR/ GR because they are they elected representatives of the class and have access to the chairman and other students because quarreling or fighting start with minor issues and spreads at wider level with the passage of time. Dialogues on Safe Campus

Attia Welfare Society is implementing a project namely “A Safe and Tolerant Campus) in (10) departments of the Islamic University Bahawalpur (IUB) i.e. Social Work (focal department), Sports Sciences, Agronomy, Horticulture, Botany, Computer Sciences, Physics, Mathematic, Psychology and Education where (10) peace clubs were formed and capacitated for countering violent extremism. These peace clubs capacity were built on and around CVE, critical thinking and leadership, communication and critical thinking skills.

In collaboration with department of Social Work of ISB, AWS organized (10) virtual dialogue session in which total (519) students (257) male and (262) female participated including 35 Agronomy (10 male & 25 female, 60 Botany(11 male & 49 female), 48 Horticulture (33 male & 15 female, , 53 Education 34 male, 19 female, 48 Sports Science 37 male & 11 female), 48 Sports Science (37 male & 11 female), 49 Social Work(30 male & 19 female), Mathematics(39 male& 17 female), Psychology (5 male & 51 female), Computer Science 64(40 male & 24 female and56 Physics (39 male & 17 female) participated. These sessions were planned to conduct physically but in the wake (Covid- 19), university is closed and classes are banned, so these session were conducted via (Zoom).

The prime of these dialogues session was followed by panel discussion, three days and two days training of peace club members to provide a plate from where students can express their views, queries, questions to make the IUB Campus as safe tolerant for better learning environment by accepting and celebrating the diversity, multiversity, respecting and ensuring rights of opinions, culture, tribes, caste, religions and resolving conflict through dialogue, discussion, debate with reasoning and logical way. In organizing these (10) dialogue sessions different guest speakers from academia and govt. institution and participated.

Speakers made a result oriented discussion concentrating on the accepting the diversity, cultural, caste, color, regions and religions to create and make the university environment peace full, tolerant and safer for better learning environment.

Following key guest speakers from IUB campus and Govt. institutions participated consecutively in all the sessions listed under:

1. Dr. Muhammad Asif Naveed Ranjha Chairman, Department of Social Work, IUB
2. Syed Mansoor Ali Shah Lecturer Department of Social Work, IUB
3. Aftab Ahmad Lecturer Department of Social Work, IUB

Dr. Asif Naveed Ranjha Chairman Department of Social Work, The Islamia University Bahawalpur performed as facilitator and guest speakers as well throughout conducting these sessions. In the start of sessions, he warmly welcomed the peace club members and guest speakers by sharing the objectives and background of the project and put question on and around safe campus to start the dialogue. Such

important questions i.e. were put from the participants i.e. role of students in making the campus as tolerant, peaceful, harmonize and acceptable for all, role of teachers, faculty and administration, role of other stakeholders in university i.e. security, department of student affairs, board of study, hostel, janitorial and transport services facilities because as whole these associated department plays pivotal and key role in maintaining the campus environment peaceful. What actions university should take to make the environment as safe and tolerant?

1. Dr. Muhammad Asif Naveed Ranjha Chairman, Department of Social Work, IUB said that when two are more persons jointly sit together on any matter to conclude through discussion called dialogues. If we talk about the stakeholders of the university, who are them, what are their roles, duties, needs, requirements for a safe, secure, tolerant, peaceful, through accepting the diversity for better learning environment including proper sitting arrangement, transport system, security, behaviors of clerical staff, department and faculty teachers, administration etc. he further shared that before organizing this dialogue, in support with Social Work Department, AWS conducted panel discussion forum and three days training of peace club members on the subject matters. Students asked different questions and raised questions on the behaviour of the students, teachers, faculty members, administration, security personnel, fleet system, Hostel, discrimination from the teachers, acceptability, social acceptance and to accept the diversity.

2. Syed Mansoor Ali Shah Lecturer Department of Social Work, IUB Syed put light on the relation of teachers and students, role of teachers and students and role of university as an institution to provide peaceful environment. He said that as student, student should behave well with all teachers, faculty and administration and security personnel in order get their support at all level. If any of the students observes any violation, he she should at once report and come in to the knowledge the teacher to resolve and mitigate it. Mostly students use wrong way and channel for resolving and managing the conflicts. Every students should compliance the university rules and focus on study and learning. Teachers will automatically will behave will when students will attend the classes, participating in other

3. Aftab Ahmad Lecturer Department of Social Work, IUB said that student, administration and all other sections should play its role to build and sustained peace. He said that in university almost 2200 students were enrolled but 20000 new admission were done. In this time, size of the students increased while the infrastructures is the same. Sometimes complaints receives against someone and matter is being enquiring but students do not wait and start quarreling and disruption started. But should understand that there are (20000) students but due to new enrollment, now students have increased up to (40000) but the capacity in hostel is overloaded and problem exists. Students will have to compromise by giving space in heart and soul through welcoming and accepting the diversity.

Muhammad Uzair Deputy Director Social Welfare Bahawalpur firstly paid thanks to AWS for inviting a guest speaker. He said that Covid has changed the lives of people and closest them through technology. Ge said that he has listened the views of students and feel pleasure that they are thinking positive side. All the departments established in the university providing their best services to students and trying their efforts to address the students query well in time

Project Closing Ceremony:

Attia Welfare Society arranged online project closing ceremony of “A Safe & Tolerant Campus” to promote peace, harmony, tolerance and making campus environment peaceful. More than hundred participants comprising on students, faculty members of natural science departments of IUB, local parliamentarian, University Syndicate members, media personnel, civil society and representatives of local partner organization participated in the event.

Muhammad Waseem Aslam host of the event, formally welcomed the participants and briefed about project. He said that peace message reached out to (3450) people including, students, faculty and university administration through different activities including organizing two days and three days training workshops, panel discussion, debate competitions and celebrating international days. The project remained successful to engage the students and sensitized them on peace, harmony, tolerance, and to accept the diversity. He further added that these kinds of projects played vital role to disseminate and promote message among youth especially students.

To achieve the project objectives, different activities were conducted. (10) Peace Clubs were formed and capacitated on countering violent extremism, CVE, critical thinking and leadership organizing two days and three days works followed by three days virtual training of faculty members and university staff. Different SAPS activities i.e. dialogues, debate competitions, panel discussion and international days were celebrated to deliver message of peace. All these SAPs activities were conducted virtually in the wake of Covid-19.

In total, 36 activities were done. Peace Club’s members capacity were enhanced which supported to increase their knowledge, on peace, CVE to end violent behaviour among the students to promote peace, tolerance and harmony. Total (3450) people including (3336) students including Male (1728) and (1608), (95) Faculty Members including (81) Male Faculty Members, (14) Female Faculty members and (19) person from CSOs, Media, Govt. Representative, University Administration & Parliamentarian participated.

Sharing of Case Study by Peace Club Members:

On behalf of students, Mr. Rashid shared his story in conjunction with the project activities. He said that a safe and tolerant campus project was unique and it enchanted us to work as peace club members, peace promoters, peace disseminator and peace promoter in the university.

As university student I would recommend that project has achieved its desired results as we have been

foreseeing at the inception of the project. As member of peace club, I have participated in all activities and learned that how to resolve conflicts especially raised in class room level. He further shared that contents of training was very important especially conflict management, leadership, critical thinking and communication skills which not only gave knowledge rather than we learned how to accept others. The project has knocked us to behave well especially the students come from other tribes, religions, caste and provinces and respect them as we expect that people should give us.

Experience Sharing by the Peace Club Members & Faculty Members:

Mr. Uzair Deputy Director Social Welfare Bahawalpur said that University is big institute where students come from different area, regions, tribes, caste, creed and color. Due to this, social differences exists among students which is natural. All differences should resolve amicably to maintain and build peace in campus.

Dr. Asif Naveed Ranjha, Chairman Department of Social Work said that engaging throughout the project activities, I also learned from the students and changed the views. On this occasion, he appreciated the vision of Vice Chancellor to make this university peaceful and nominating as focal person in this project. In project activities, students were given equal opportunities to discuss their problems and gave valuable suggestions to resolve the problems. As major stakeholders their contribution is equally important and peace cannot be build and sustained without engaging them. As a major stakeholders of the university, this is the responsibility of students to cooperate with university administration to create and sustain peace in university. At the end, he suggested that project should be upscale in future to disseminate the message of peace throughout the campus which is necessary and will fulfill the ultimate objectives of safe and tolerant campus.

Doctor Muhammad Afzal MPA & Member Syndicate IUB appreciated AWS efforts to promote peace, harmony and tolerance among students of IUB. He said that civil society should fully support to public sectors to promote peace, harmony and respect of opinions among the society.

Dr. Awis Professour IUB appraised AWS and Social Work department on this initiatives. He said that our religion is a religion of peace and our holy book openly says that do not go in sectarian. There is great need to create tolerance among the society especially youngster. Difference of opinion is natural but we should deal the people with respective way. Such projects support to change the mindset of public. Resultantly, society becomes peaceful and tolerated. He said that in some activities personally participated and listened student's remarks which were positives.

Outcomes of the ceremony:

In this virtual Project closing ceremony total (116) people including (95) peace club members participated in which (35) Male &60 (Female) 10 Faculty members & university Administration, (1) Parliamentarian, (2) Media personnel, (2) Govt. representatives and (4) persons from Partner organization participated

Closing Remarks by Chief Guest

Chief Guest, Sumera Malik Spokesperson Chief Minister Punjab & Member Syndicate IUB said that message of peace, tolerance, harmony was disseminated in effective way among students.

She said that she is happy that female students remained fully engaged in different project activities. She further said that such types of projects should be launched in the best interest of the society.

She suggested that civil society should work jointly with public sectors to promote peace, harmony and tolerance in the society especially focusing the youth.

Conclusion & Way Forward:

At the end, it was ensured by the faculty that as the classes will formally start, Peace club members will be delivering messages among the other students to promote tolerance, harmony to make the campus environment peaceful.

Challenges:

- It was challenging to conduct the kick off in university and convince them for the implementation of the Project within university.
- To sign MOU with the IUB Bahawalpur because of the transfer of Vice Chancellor.
- During organizing and conducting mobilization, the team had to face different challenges, i.e. taking formal permission from University management and signing of MOU.
- Students were a little bit worried about the schedule of the training, keeping in view the sufferance of their study. Female students were reluctant to become the part of peace club members.
- More students were interested to become the part of peace club but due to restriction of 30 members could not take on board.
- More students were interested to become the part of peace club but due to restriction of 30 members could not take on board.
- It was very challenging especially to develop training manual for capacity building of the students. Selection of the contents, topic and material was a big challenge.
- Difficult to engage students due to announcement of final exams of the university as topics were finalizing by the teachers.
- Students were very reluctant and denying to participate in training session due to wasting of time for their study.
- Due to timing of training session, students were also reluctant to participate.
- It was difficult to start the training due to the closure of university during pandemic Covid 19 as the students were staying at home.
- It was also difficult to engage students due to virtual exam as the university was closed because of pandemic disease of Covid -19.
- Internet problem remained exists because students were belonging to far away areas and students were staying at home,
- On zoom app, maximum participation was allowed up to 100 people, but participants increased which was difficult to manage it.

Mitigation Strategy:

- Several meetings were done with university administration, department of student affairs, VC office and department of social work to build consensus on the importance of the project.
- By ensuring strong follow up, strong coordination university stake holders, MOU signed and kick off workshops conducted.
- Engaging of students, university administration, and faculty members at a one page to initiate and successful complete the project
- Students were briefed about the project objectives and cleared that WAS has signed MOU with Vice Chancellor Office and take formal permission to start project activities.
- Department of Student Affairs remained fully on board and Social Work was the focal department to initiate and lead the activities towards safe and tolerant campus project.
- The students were mobilized and cleared that training schedule will be formulated keeping in view their study schedule in order to avoid from suffering of their study.
- Female students were encouraged and mobilized for contributing their role in peace promotion activities
- Different consultation sessions were conducted with consultant and Azem-Pakistan team which helped AWS for selection of topic, preparation of training manual and IEC material on safe and tolerant campus for IUB students. The most relevant topics were made the part of this guiding document for the capacity building of students.
- Meetings were done with department's heads and teachers were engaged. Teachers directed that those students of peace club members will attend the session, he / she will be exempt from quiz and the Quiz will be based on the training session. After that students participated in the training session.
- Timing of training session were adjusted as per availability of the students
- The trainer supported all the peace club members according to their need. Trainer codes different local and simple example for the delivering of the message. The group work after each session of the training also helped to brings all the youth members on same page.
- Meetings were done with department's heads and teachers to engage the students. AWS team mobilized and convinced the IUB management and faculty members to start online / virtual training session and supported them.
- AWS team is ensured follow up and made strong coordination with students, university administration and faculty members on what's, app and telephone.
- Students were coordinated and follow up were made. As per their convenience, schedule were revised.
- Students were requested to participate from good signals are available in order to avoid interruption.
- What's app groups was created and communication were done via communicating in the group

Lesson Learned:

- It was learned that through proper channel, strong follow up and coordination desired results can be achieved.
- By following process, adhering the policy and rules of any institutions, all relevant stakeholders support and extend their cooperation.
- It was new and unique experience for mobilization team that how to work with students and faculty especially to engage, sensitize and mobilize adults students.
- Time management is highly important while treating and conducting activities in University.
- Working with students and faculty was unique experience to engage, sensitize and mobilize adults students.
- To start virtual training session, this experience remained successful and proved successful.
- If any organization does not change its planning and strategy, they cannot achieve their targets.
- During exam, students should not engage in any activity
- Strong coordination and follow up opens new era to implement the project activities
Dialogues, discussion and debate provides opportunity to students to present their version in well-mannered way in any specific issue proved from these debate completions. Such debate competitions should be conducted in university at class level, department level, and university level.
- Dialogues create interaction among students and present their version. So the culture of dialogue should encourage and remained fruitful.
- At least 30 % students joined the sessions from 10 to 15 KM away from their homes due to signal problem which shows their interest that how students are taking it serious which is appreciable.



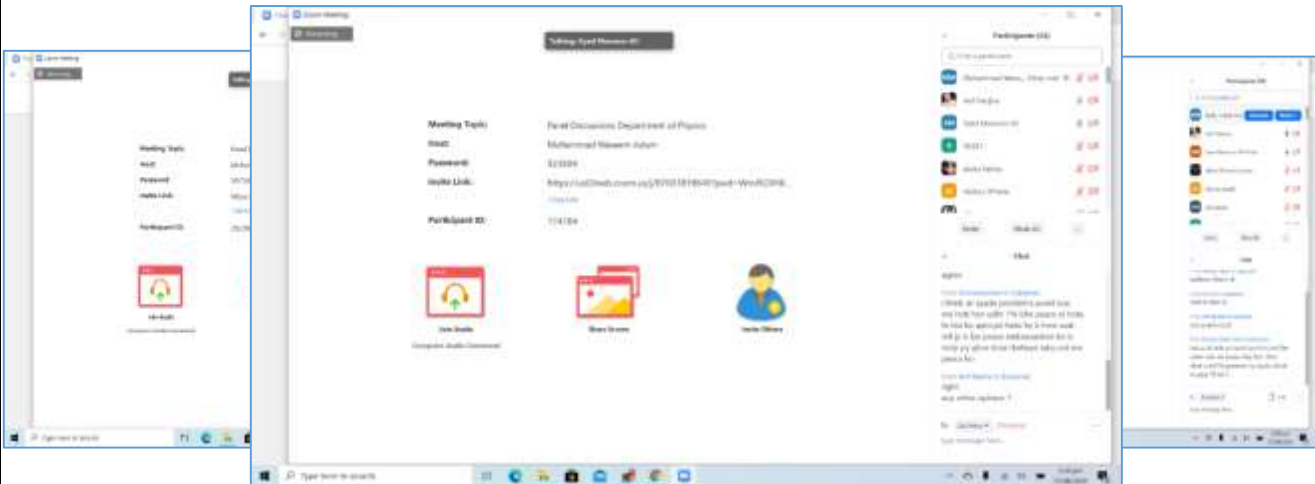
Figure 65. Dr. Asif Naveed Ranjha is addressing on safe & tolerant campus

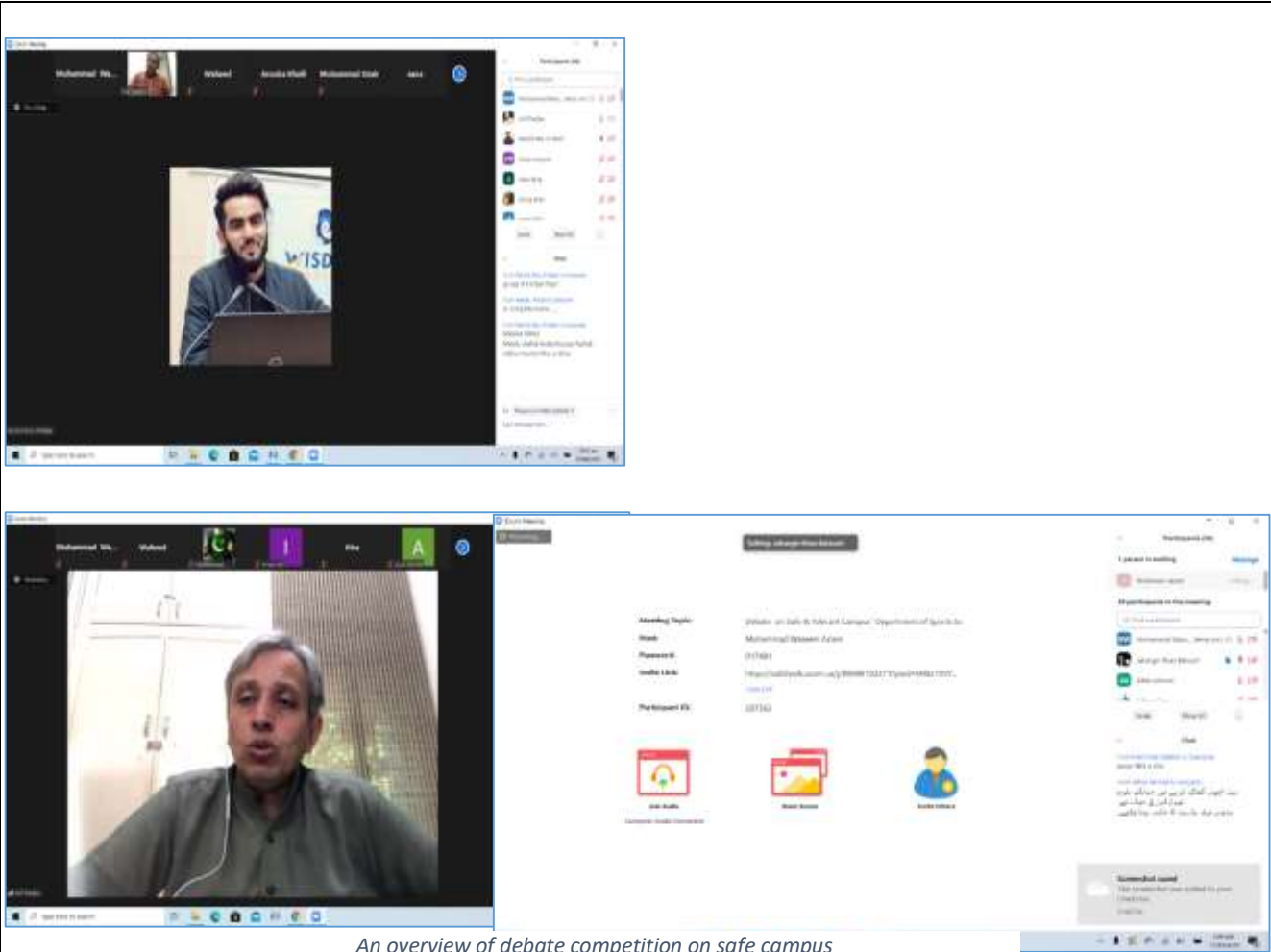

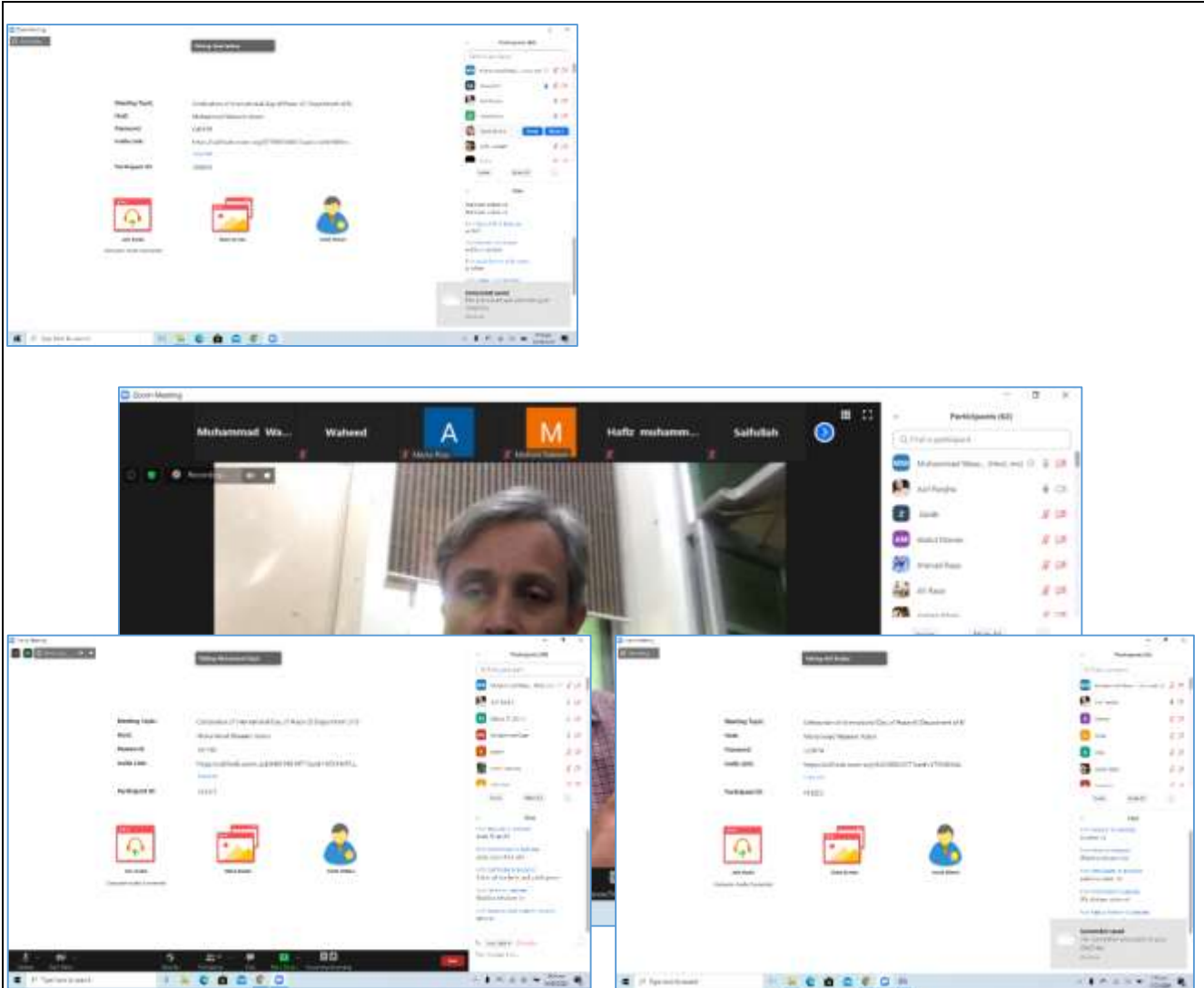

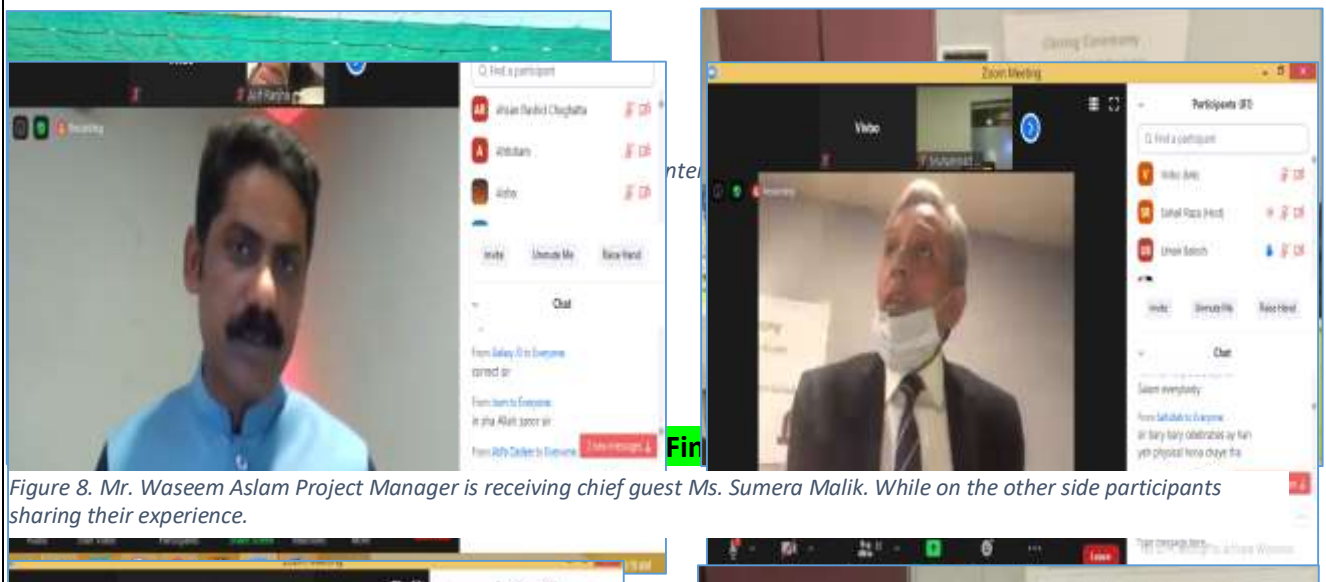


Figure 8. Mr. Waseem Aslam Project Manager is receiving chief guest Ms. Sumera Malik. While on the other side participants sharing their experience.
